Emancipation and International Conflicts

In Saint Domingue, the French, Spanish, and British fought for and claimed territory across the western third of the island. Spain ceded all of Santo Domingo to France in 1795 with the collansed when Toussaint Louverture and his 4,000 troops switched their allegiance from the Spanish to the French flag in May, 1794. The formerly enslaved, black Louverture was fast-becoming the most significant colonial general on the island. The British departed in 1798, leaving the entire island temporarily free of the threat of re-enslavement. Read less ^
